- D371      **Compliance is Just the Beginning** (DVD, 56 minutes)  
A training resource to help people at all levels make better ethical decisions. Program 1 introduces the process. Former Enron executive Lynn Brewer and six ethics experts discuss the pressures people can feel that may lead them to make poor decisions. Explores the importance of being aware of our core values, as well as the standards of behaviour expected by our organizations and communities. Outlines the three steps a person can take when faced with a tough ethical choice. Program 2 presents eight dramatized scenarios, familiar ethical issues most people will face at some time, with commentary by the experts after, for viewers to discuss, practice and reinforce the concepts in program 1.
