- D521 or V3247**      **AHA Guidelines for CPR and Emergency Care** (DVD or video, 25 minutes, 2007)  
This program highlights changes from the American Heart Association regarding how rescue workers are to administer CPR. This program also includes a demonstration of how to provide treatment for a patient in cardiac distress using the new guidelines. (TWL Knowledge Group)
- D676 or V3266**      **American Heat, May 2008: Thermal Imaging** (DVD or video, 30 minutes, 2008)  
This program discusses the technology behind thermal imagers. It also emphasizes the proper use of these imagers. There are several pitfalls and problems that may be encountered while using a thermal imager. Techniques to avoid those pitfalls are examined. This program also discusses the basics of training with thermal imagers, including common misconceptions that can lead to improper or unsafe use. (TWL Knowledge Group)
- D496**      **Balance: Problem Gambling Awareness for Aboriginal Communities across B.C.**  
(DVD, 25 minutes, 2000)  
Gambling has always been a big part of the First Nations culture and traditional ways, but for some people, excessive gambling can begin to destroy their lives and their family relationships. Through increased awareness of the risks involved in gambling and a return to traditional values and practices, First Nations communities can enjoy the games without the harmful effects of problem gambling. (Problem Gambling Program of B.C.)
- D509**      **Crime Stories, Episode 2: Abbotsford Killer** (DVD, 46 minutes, 2004)  
In 1995, terror descended upon the community of Abbotsford, B.C. An attack on two teenage girls left one dead and started a 7-month siege of torment. The killer was in hiding, phoning and taunting both police and community with details of his horrific crimes. Behind the voice was Terry Driver, a devoted husband and father with a terrifying double life. His crimes changed the community forever. (Partners in Motion Pictures Inc.)
- D563**      **100 Days of Freedom** (DVD, 45 minutes, 2006)  
This television documentary follows three federal inmates who are being released back into society after serving long term incarcerations: David, a former thousand-dollar-a-day cocaine addict who fueled his addiction with a string of robberies; Gloria, a former prostitute and drug addict, convicted of a violent gang-on-gang home invasion; and Wayne, also convicted of a violent home invasion who has only seen three years of freedom in the last 30 years. (Cooper Rock Pictures Inc.)
- D347**      **Order Out of Chaos** (DVD, 30 minutes, 2006)  
No matter the size or type of a fire incident, departments must use and follow an Incident Command System (ICS). Through footage of actual incident command strategies, this program explores the insights and instruction of progressive users of ICS and demonstrates how to put the fundamental elements of ICS into practice. (Trinity Workplace Learning and Fire & Emergency Training Network)
- D495**      **Plagiarism: It's a Crime** (DVD, 22 minutes, 2006)  
Plagiarism is the one act that can get a student expelled from college — no questions asked. This program presents the definition of plagiarism and what acts constitute plagiarism. It also outlines ways to keep from committing this academic “crime” and its consequences, by implementing proper research and documentation strategies. - D442**                    **Self Protection** (DVD, 29 minutes, 2007)  
Selecting the proper type of personal protection equipment is important for the protection of health care workers from exposure to contaminated patients. This program explains the different choices in personal protection equipment and discusses the issues involved in selecting the correct ensemble. (Emergency Film Group)
- D473**                    **Social Intelligence in the Consulting Room** (DVD, 81 minutes, 2007)  
Daniel Goleman has introduced millions of people around the world to the concept that how we handle our emotions is more important to success in life than IQ. This keynote address, delivered by Daniel Siegel in absence of Daniel Goleman at the 2007 Psychotherapy Networker Symposium, explores how the new science of social neurobiology and the principles of social intelligence can enhance psychotherapy. (Playback Now, Inc.)
- D352 or**                    **Terrorism Preparedness: Critical Incident Management** (DVD or video, 30 minutes, 2007)  
**V3180**                    This program illustrates the Montgomery County Incident Management System, explaining how the Montgomery County system supports the National Incident Management System (NIMS). NIMS permits the incident commander to use his or her authority to manage a large-scale, multi-agency event by delegating responsibility to subordinates to carry out specific functions. This program discusses the organizational structure of the NIMS system and its five major functions. The Montgomery County example can be adapted and applied to most regions. (Trinity Workplace Learning and Fire & Emergency Training Network)
- D513**                    **This Is My Body: A Film by High School Girls** (DVD, 35 minutes, 2007)  
Featuring a collage of girls' voices, this program is based on short documentary films made by a group of teenage girls over one school year. The students attended a Montreal all-girls high school and were enrolled in a media literacy and video production course. They share their experiences of what it means to be a girl at this time in their lives. (National Film Board of Canada)
- D506**                    **Trolley Square: The Night "Rapid Response" Worked** (DVD, 41 minutes, 2007)  
At a popular Salt Lake City, Utah mall, an 18-year-old gunman shoots nine people, 5 of them fatally, before he is engaged by an off-duty officer from a neighboring jurisdiction. Within minutes Salt Lake City PD officers arrive and form an emergency response team in a "textbook" real-life demonstration of rapid response to the active shooter training. This program addresses considerations in responding to an active shooter. It also discusses considerations of off-duty response to a crime in progress. (In the Line of Duty)
- D519**                    **The Water's Edge: Profits and Policy Behind the Rising Catastrophe of Floods**  
(DVD, 57 minutes, 2006)  
This documentary takes a critical look at the systemic failures behind the growing catastrophe of floods in the United States. Through an amazing collection of flood footage and in-depth coverage of repetitive flood victims, this program uncovers the profiteering and neglect that ensure increasing devastation for our ever-urbanizing society. The perspective of this program is that the precious land at the water's edge, so vital for wildlife corridors and open space, is being turned into a federally-subsidized disaster zone that brings great fortune to bankers and builders and the perpetual debt of the underclass. (Flood Safety Project)

He has made major gifts to a number of post-secondary institutions including the University of Western Ontario, University of British Columbia, Simon Fraser University and the University of Northern British Columbia. He is currently Chair of UNBC's Board of Governors and Chair of the Vancouver Board of Trade. In 2007, Dr. Rix was named to the Order of Canada. His other honours include the Queen's Golden Jubilee Award (2002) and Biotechnology Alliance Lifetime Achievement Award (2001).

On July 8, 2008 the JIBC announced the Dr. Donald B. Rix Public Safety Simulation Building in recognition of the generous support Dr. Rix has provided to the Institute. In addition to the Library gift, an endowment has been established to provide student financial assistance, funding will be directed toward completing the Rescue Tower at the Maple Ridge Campus, and new simulated learning environments have been created.

The generosity of the Rix Family Foundation will help the JIBC provide a better, more technologically advanced learning environment for students - with enhanced Library services to complement the learning experience. The entire justice and public safety community will benefit from this extraordinary gift.
