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# Library Services and Resources for Students www.jibc.ca/library

- Always feel free to contact the JIBC Library at <a href="mailto:library@jibc.ca">library@jibc.ca</a> or 604-528-5599 with any questions.
- eResources: ALL JIBC students (whether taking one course or a full program) are eligible for the
  Username & Password to access the eResources from off-campus. The password always expires on
  August 31<sup>st</sup>. The Username and Password will be included in course materials or is available from the
  Library.
  - eResources include: online articles, eBooks, eNewspapers, Canadian case law and legislation, and streaming media (videos) from sources such as National Film Board, CBC, Criminal Justice & Public Safety.
- Borrowing: In addition to eResource access, JIBC students enrolled in a PROGRAM have full borrowing privileges from the Library.
  - o The Library provides a **free mailing service** to all students registered in a JIBC **PROGRAM.**
  - Students may borrow while on-campus, and, if necessary, the Library will provide an envelope and mailing label to return items to the Library (e.g. for students unable to visit the New Westminster campus).
  - Students may call or email the Library to request items be mailed to them. When the items are mailed, students are provided with a postage-paid return mailing label.
  - Students who are *NOT* in a Program may request JIBC Library *books* by visiting their public, college/university or corporate Library to request an *interlibrary loan*.
- Research Help: All students may call, email or visit the Library for help with research. This includes help finding articles, books, DVDs, and more.
- APA Citation: All sources must be cited in APA Style. Use the APA Subject Guide http://libguides.jibc.ca/apa or contact a Librarian.
- AskAway: An online library chat reference service available to students. It goes beyond JIBC Library
  hours, so is a great resource to use when the JIBC Library is closed. Check Library webpage for hours.
- WriteAway: An online writing support service where students can submit an essay (online) and receive feedback with suggestions for improvement, within 24-48 hours. Check the Writing Centre on the Library webpage.
