It is an interesting depiction of a community-based protocol in action and can be used as the basis for discussion, for general information, or for assistance in setting up similar programs and protocols. A powerful drama looking at the real and pressing problem of wife assault from the perspective of the children, this program is presented through the eyes of Billy, a 15 year old. The video explores the difficult choices which have to be made--and how the cycle of violence can be broken. (National Film Board) (HQ 809 C766 1989)
- V3159 **Domestic Violence** (video, 74 minutes)
Training video for social workers, nurses and other health professionals. Part 1 presents a historical overview of the issue of violence against women. - V3151 **How Then Shall We Live: A Process for Developing a Plan to Escape Abusive Relationships** (video, 24 minutes)
Focuses on the secrecy surrounding domestic violence. The program contains stories of hope for women who are in violent relationships, and provides valuable information on how to leave an abusive partner. Topics covered include the following: recognizing the need to leave; preparing to leave; leaving; and recovering and rebuilding. (Live Wire Video Productions) (HV 6626 H698 1999)
- V3215 **In Our Best Interest: Part II** (video, 90 minutes)
This video contains four 20- to 25-presentations from a two-day training seminar for battered women, advocates, women's group facilitators, and community activists on the Duluth curriculum. The program examines personal, institutional, and cultural action to end violence against women. It includes discussions on how racism, sexism, homophobia, and classism contribute to violence. - V2407 **It's Not Like I Hit Her** (video, 23 minutes)
This video focuses on and illustrates the problem of emotional abuse by men of their intimate women partners. It makes the point that abusive behaviour is not normal and shows that abusive men can learn to recognize the impact of their behaviour on their partners. (Education Toward Change Society and Victoria Family Violence Prevention Society.) (HV 6626 I875 2000)
- V393 **Loved, Honoured and Bruised** (video, 26 minutes)
Jeannie Fox, mother of four children, tells her story of her 16-year marriage to a man who physically and mentally abused her. (National Film Board) (HQ 536 L68 1980)
- V743 **One Hit Leads to Another** (video, 15 minutes)
This educational package is designed to stimulate discussion and destroy common myths surrounding wife assault. The video combines brief dramatic scenes with real life interviews with victims and offenders. (Victoria Women's Transition House) (HV 6626 0544 1990)
- V3152 **Out from Abuse: Older Women's Long-Term Survival** (video, 30 minutes)
This resource package helps address the impact of domestic violence on the quality of life of older women, and assists service providers to respond more sensitively and proactively. (National Film Board of Canada) (HV 6626 O98 1999)
- V1169 **A Place to Start** (video, 41 minutes)
This educational video package is for women who have been assaulted by their husbands or boyfriends. Many will be going to court as witnesses for the prosecution in wife assault cases. The video and handbook help them to understand the Canadian criminal law and court process by relating personal experiences of abused women, and through professionals' descriptions of the process. This is a docudrama for general audiences and those who work with children, abused women and assaultive men. It explores the many serious emotional and physical effects on children who witness violence in their homes. - V3216 **A Theoretical Framework for Understanding Battering: A Speech by Susan Schecter** (video, 60 minutes)
Provides background material for understanding the causes of domestic violence in order to form better public policy and improve intervention. (Duluth Domestic Abuse Intervention Project) (HV 6626 T446 1992)
- V1583 **Violence against Women: Breaking the Silence** (video, 60 minutes)
Offers stories of hope for women who are in violent relationships. Includes: who to call for help, how to get out, how the police can help, children of violence, and how to break the silence. (Friday Communications, Inc.) (HV 6626 V5586 1995)
- V3230 **Voices Heard Sisters Unseen** (video, 76 minutes)
Battered women relate their experiences through a variety of forms of expression--poetry, journals, performance art, etc. (Women Make Movies) (HV 6626.2 V65 1995)
- V1157 **What About Us?** (video, 28 minutes)
This is a video which is presented entirely from the children's point of view and is intended for use in a group counselling setting to help children talk about and cope with their own experiences of abuse and to reassure them that they are not alone. Dramatic vignettes follow the progress of one or more children as they receive counselling on an individual and group level in sessions such as those provided by the Children Who Witness Abuse Program. (B.C./Yukon Society of Transition Houses) (HQ 809 W423 1993)
- V1253 **When Women Kill** (video, 48 minutes)
A powerful documentary about battered women who, after years of violence, kill their abusers. Three women lead us through the stories of the abuse they endured, abuse that led them to that moment when they stood to defend their lives. The film examines the court treatment of the "murdress" - past and present - and challenges the legal system to confront the systematic and widespread violence that men inflict daily on the home front. - V3157 **Why Don't You Just Leave** (video, 28 minutes)
Presents poetic images, uncompromising text, and voices of men and women to expose the implications of domestic violence towards women and the inability or unwillingness of society and our justice system to confront the issue. Created as a video installation piece for a travelling exhibition of paintings by artist Anne Popperwell. (Moving Images) (HV 6626 W493 1996)
- V3223 **Why She Stays: A Dilemma Faced By Service Providers** (video, 25 minutes)
Why do women return, time and time again, to an abusive partner? This frequently asked question is both puzzling and confusing to most professionals who provide helping services to battered women. This video explores the frustrations experienced by the police, the Courts, medical personnel and victim assistance workers as they attempt to understand why a woman willingly returns to face the same abuse. - V1104 **Without Fear** (video, 26 minutes)
This video about violence against women includes interviews with 6 survivors of violence and abuse plus dramatic vignettes. It presents statistics throughout, which indicate the extent of violence against women in Canada. (National Film Board of Canada)
