Every day, JIBC graduates working in BC, throughout Canada and abroad are there for people in need. When there is an accident, a natural disaster, a crime that has been committed, or a conflict that needs resolving, justice and public safety professionals educated at JIBC are at the frontlines of the emergency response. Our graduates also contribute to a larger spectrum of safety – from prevention to response to recovery.

The BC Government established JIBC as a provincial Institute in 1978. More than 30 years after those beginnings, we've evolved into a public post-secondary educational institution with a worldwide reputation for delivering comprehensive and innovative education and training to about 34,000 students annually.

Our students take a wide range of programs and courses in three schools:

**School of Community & Social Justice:** conflict resolution, mediation, negotiation, counselling, leadership, instructor development, and Aboriginal programs;

**School of Health Sciences:** paramedicine, professional health education and continuing medical education for physicians and nurses;

**School of Public Safety & Security:** policing, sheriffs, security, investigation, enforcement, corrections, fire fighting, emergency management, and driver education.

Our Centre for Graduate Studies & Academic Planning also offers liberal studies courses.

## ABORIGINAL STUDENT SERVICES



## PERSONAL AND EDUCATIONAL COUNSELLING

Recognizing the complex demands on students, JIBC provides free and confidential counselling. The goal is to assist in planning students' academic paths, and ensure these paths fit their learning and career goals. Students who are juggling work, family and social life while pursuing post secondary studies and professional growth opportunities can become overwhelmed. JIBC Student Counselling Services help students to plan their class and study time and to develop a balanced schedule. With counselling resources, students can keep all the balls in the air and achieve their educational goals.



## LIBRARY

The JIBC Library offers research assistance and access to a unique and specialized collection of books, journals and online sources, all focused on the programs offered here. The Library catalogue and other online resources may be searched while on a JIBC campus or over the web from other locations. JIBC librarians are available to help locate information on subjects taught at JIBC and assist students with a variety of academic and research skills, such as locating the most current journal articles or citing sources correctly. Computers available for student use in the Library all have Microsoft Office and Internet access, and a wireless network covers the entire building. Laptops and iPads are available to certificate, diploma or degree program students for short-term loan. Each group study room in the Library is equipped with a computer, 40-inch monitor and a DVD/VHS player.

## SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

JIBC is committed to providing a safe, inclusive and accessible environment for students with disabilities. A disability may include any long term or recurring mobility, hearing, visual, or learning disability, or a mental and physical health condition that affects learning.

Zach Parker wanted to become a more effective Council Member of his community, and he found a program that could help him develop his strengths – JIBC’s Aboriginal Leadership Certificate. Now Chief of Ulkatcho First Nation in Anahim Lake, BC, Zach draws on new tools learned at JIBC to negotiate with government officials and members of his community.

“I now have the skill set to deal with intergenerational and residential school trauma and colonialism. I am able to handle conflict proactively, so that we can get past the place where conflict usually shuts people down.” In his new role as Chief, Zach is able to utilize his leadership skills to help strengthen his community. “I can help people go beyond conflict and hear what our members and fellow leaders have to say.”

When Cynthia Klassen was looking to find employment as a career fire fighter, she turned to JIBC to gain the skills and certification she needed to meet her goals. As a paid on-call fire fighter with Surrey Fire Services, Cynthia uses the skills she learned at JIBC to be team player. “I learned discipline in the program. JIBC gave me all the entry level skills I need, so that I know what to expect and how to behave as a rookie in the fire

service.” Cynthia has found that the certifications she achieved, as well as the preparation and support she received from her instructors, have helped her through the challenging recruitment processes from local fire departments. “My experience in the program far exceeded my expectations. Not only did I get the skills required, but I have all these other abilities that are icing on the cake.”



## Fire and Safety

The Fire & Safety Division meets the educational needs of career and volunteer fire fighters, as well as industrial and marine personnel. Programs offered range from introductory hands-on courses, to advanced diplomas and degrees.
