## **Use of On-road Evaluations for Identification of Impairment and Retraining of Older Drivers**

**Significant driver behaviour components,  
identified from 3 areas of study.**



### **Conclusions:**

- Overlap among the sources of information is evident
- Research to identify the most useful components in on-road driving evaluation is extremely limited, most notably for retraining programs
- Those components identified above may be used in developing a procedure to target candidates and behaviors for driver training
