Driver Education Centre (DEC) at Justice Institute of British Columbia invites applications for the full-time position of Advanced Driving Instructor for its Fleet Safety and Emergency Vehicle Operations advanced driver training. You will become part of a dynamic faculty team committed to delivering high quality instruction. The successful applicants will instruct advanced driver courses at the Justice Institute New Westminster and Pitt Meadows campuses.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Deliver both theoretical and practical curriculum of Emergency Vehicle Operations, Collision Avoidance Driving, Total Control Driving, and Occupational Off-Road Driving;
- Work collaboratively with Lead Instructor and sessional faculty to deliver all advanced driver training within the pre-determined curriculum;
- Demonstrate and instruct advanced driving techniques on the road and closed circuit training area;
- Conduct individual driver assessments for private and public organizations using established criteria;
- Provide direction to students; this includes monitoring and providing feedback on their course performance and supporting students as required;
- Course preparation; ensuring training resources such as vehicles, track set-up and other equipment is available and ready to go when required.

Qualifications:

- Experience instructing advanced driving;
- Must demonstrate advanced and precision driving skills at an expert level;
- A valid ICBC Class 5/7 Instructors License (or be willing to complete an ICBC certified instructor course if other required qualifications are met) is preferred;
- Prior experience working in emergency services and/or fleet safety;
- Knowledge of the Motor Vehicle Act and traffic law is preferred;
- A Provincial Instructor Diploma (or equivalent) would be considered an asset for this position;
- Experience driving off-road vehicles an asset.

- Excellent written and oral communication, interpersonal skills, and a desire to share knowledge with others
- The ability to maintain a professional and effective working relationship with the students, clients, Sessional Instructors, Lead Instructor, and DEC staff;
