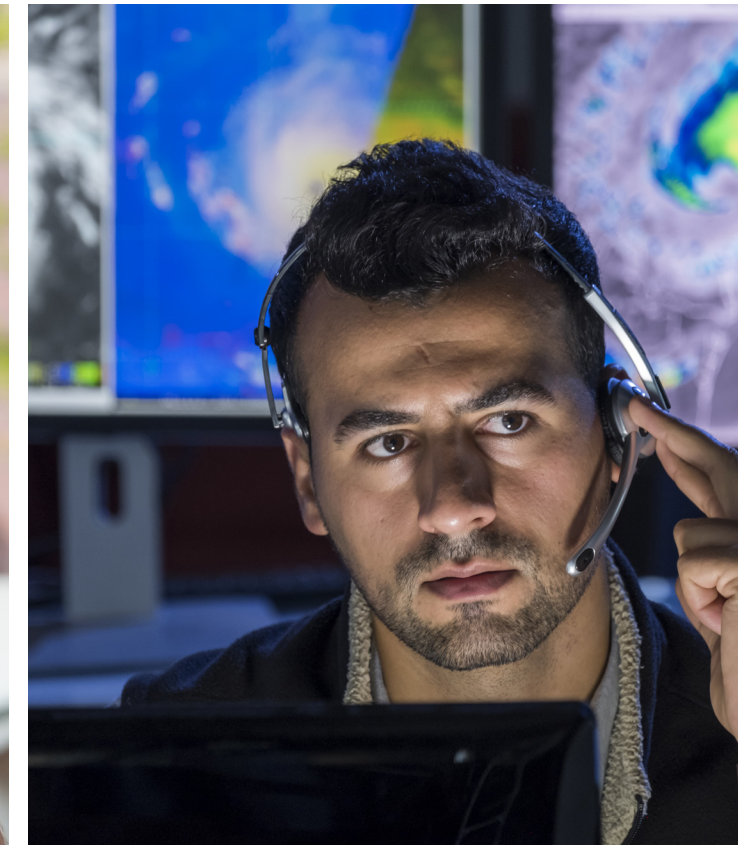
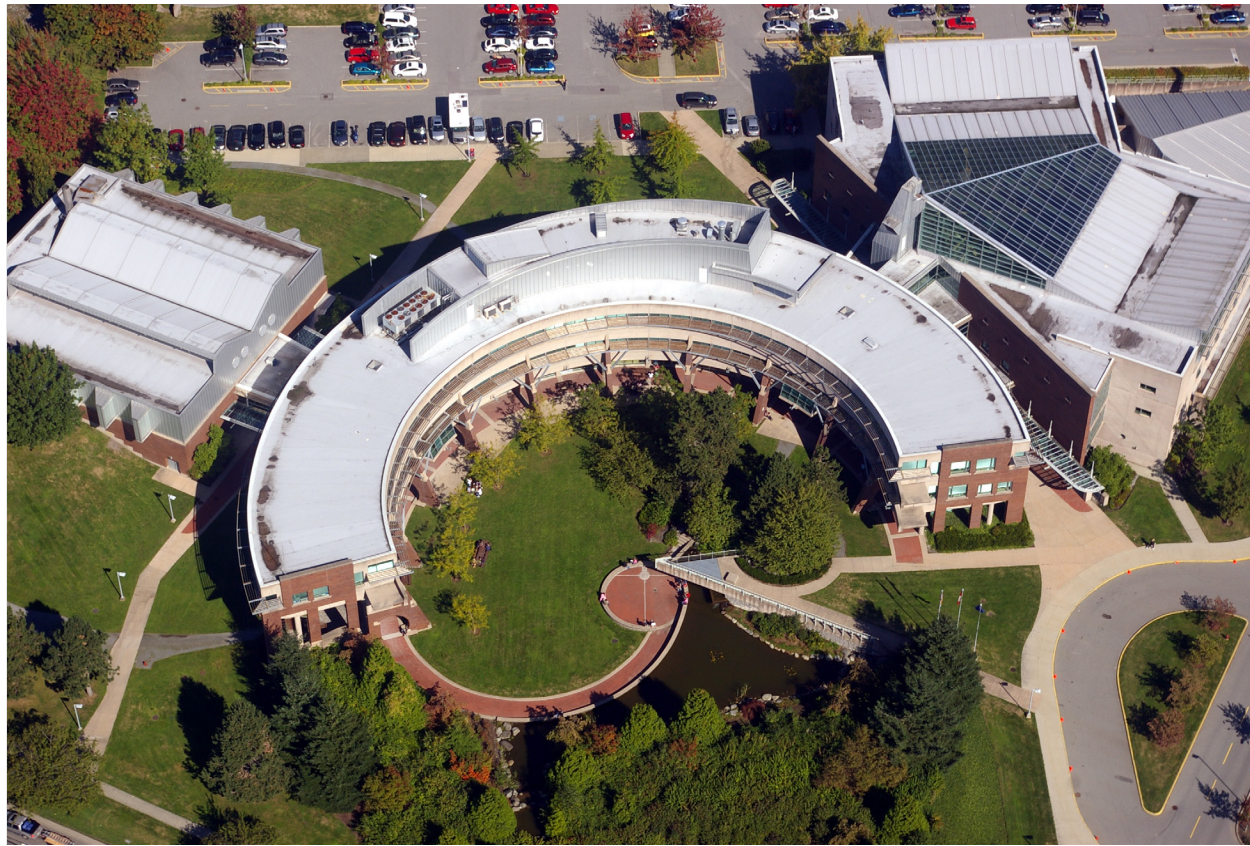

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

As English is the primary language of study at the JIBC, all applicants must meet the English proficiency requirement in order to be admitted. An applicant can fulfill the English proficiency requirement through successful completion of any of the options listed below.

- High School English 12 (C)
- IELTS (Academic): 6.5 overall, minimum of 6.0 in each skill band
- TOEFL (iBT): 80 overall, minimum 20 in each skill band
- Completion of ILAC's Pathway level 3.3
- Completion of ILSC's Pathway level A2

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For Undergraduate Diplomas and Bachelor's: Successful completion of High School (secondary school).

For Post-Baccalaureate Diplomas: Successful completion of a recognized Bachelor's Degree.

1. Send colored scanned copies of your transcripts via email*
2. Bring the official transcripts in a sealed envelope to your orientation (first week of classes)

In addition to the general undergraduate and post-baccalaureate admission requirements noted here, some programs will have additional program requirements.

*Students MAY be required to have their credentials evaluated to determine comparable levels in Canadian terms by Credential Evaluation Services (ICES) or World Education Services (WES).

- 6 Receive the **'Letter of Acceptance (LOA)'** Package
- 7 Apply for the Study Permit
