The Law Enforcement Studies Diploma (LESD) provides you with the theoretical background, applied skills, and specialized knowledge required for a career in law enforcement. This unique training will improve your chances for employment in a range of investigation and law enforcement occupations such as police officer, corrections officer, deputy sheriff, or border services guard. It will also prepare you for advancement in the rapidly growing private security field.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

The role of law enforcement and public safety officials is becoming more complex, sophisticated and technically challenging than in the past. This program will provide you with an understanding of criminal law, criminology, the Canadian criminal justice system, administrative and civil law as well as building skills in investigation, communications, emergency vehicle operation, surveillance, evidence collections and preservation, crisis intervention, use of force, and arrest and control techniques. After graduation you will be equipped with the knowledge and skills to succeed in law enforcement and public safety, making you a superior candidate in the recruiting process. LESD graduates will be able to apply for the Bachelor of Law Enforcement Studies (BLES) giving you the added benefit of expanding your academic credentials and career options.
