All provinces except Quebec	High school Grade 12 graduation is deemed to be equivalent to B.C. Grade 12.	Students must supply an official copy of their transcripts.
Quebec	Equivalency to B.C. Grade 12 requires completion of Secondary 5 (high school graduation) plus one year of CEGEP.  Some private schools offer Grade 12, which is deemed to be equivalent to B.C. Grade 12.	Students must supply an official copy of their transcripts.
<b>International Equivalencies</b>	<b>Requirements</b>	<b>Notes</b>
United States of America	Official transcripts that show completion of at least five courses at the grade 12 level, and include English, mathematics and one science course will be considered equivalent to B.C.	Students must supply an official copy of their transcripts as well as of the high school diploma itself.
All other countries	Students seeking equivalency based on international credentials must have their credentials evaluated by a recognized credential evaluation agency at their own expense.
