



Applying to the Program!

Applications for the Emergency Management Certificate Program are accepted continuously throughout the year, so students can **apply at any time – even after you've started taking courses!** Applying is easy!

- 1. Complete the JIBC's online application form https://www.jibc.ca/student-services/jibc-application-form
- 2. Email our Admissions office a 250 word letter of intent describing why you are interested in the certificate program (admissions@jibc.ca)
- 3. Contact our Admissions office to pay the \$75.00 application fee (admission@jibc.ca)

Mature students, 21 or older, are considered a mature student and do not need to submit transcripts.

Online Course Formats

Self-paced online courses can be completed on your own time within the start and end date of a course. Students have 24/7 access to the online course and all requirements need to be completed prior to the end date.

Instructor-Led Guided Online courses are facilitated by an instructor and require weekly participation. Such activities may include active engagement in discussion boards, reading of articles and case studies, sharing your ideas and perspectives, etc.
