Position Summary:

We seek an experienced, highly collaborative educational leader, passionate about post-secondary education, counselling, community safety, leadership and social justice. Ideally, you will be an educational administrator committed to student success and with a proven ability to provide leadership in staff and budget management, strategic planning, program development, delivery and evaluation. Demonstrated success inspiring and building trusting, strategic relationships is essential as is experience leading complex projects, facilitating faculty and community engagement.

As Program Director, you will oversee vision, strategic direction and operations for the Centre for Counselling and Community Safety (CCCS) and the Centre for Leadership (CL). Programming within those Centres includes courses and credentials in: leadership, Indigenous trauma and community safety, trauma informed practice, critical incident stress management, and bylaw enforcement. Programming also includes contract work with the Ministry of Children & Family Development (MCFD) and others.

Primary Responsibilities:

Leadership:

- Provides leadership for CCCS and CL and participates in the development of the School's operational planning;
- Leads the Centres' budget planning and contributes to Division's overall budget management and development;
- Supports implementation of JIBC's Strategic Plan, Indigenization Plan and Equity and Diversity policy;
- Establishes and maintains effective internal working relationships throughout JIBC and seeks opportunities to collaborate in interdisciplinary curriculum development and delivery;
- Establishes and maintains excellent relationships with key external stakeholders, including post-secondary partners, government and non-profit organizations and Indigenous agencies and communities.

Staff and Faculty Oversight:

- Participates in the development and implementation of the Division's human resource planning, recruitment and hiring;
- Plans, assigns and supervises the work of staff by providing guidance, mentoring, coaching and support;
- Completes performance appraisals/personal and professional development planning; oversees leaves, work assignments and schedules; travel and staff training;
- Oversees faculty (sessional and contractor) recruitment, hiring, engagement, development and evaluation.

Program Development and Delivery:

- Oversees management, planning, design, development, delivery, evaluation and marketing of all programs and courses (in-person, online, virtual and blended);
- Ensures JIBC's academic policies are implemented and maintained;
- Collaborates with JIBC's Centre for Teaching, Learning & Innovation, Academic Affairs, Student Services, and Institutional Research to ensure quality programming and student experience.

Financial Management:

- Oversees Centres' budget development, implementation, monitoring (monthly variance and quarterly forecasting) and resource planning;
- Develops RFP responses, contracts and other proposals;
- Contributes to Centre and Division business development and provides strategic advice to the Dean with regards to School financial decision making.

Qualifications & Requirements:

Academic:

• Graduate degree in related discipline (e.g. education, leadership, counselling, social work) or an acceptable equivalent combination of education, experience and training, along with an in-depth understanding of and experience in the post-secondary educational service.

Related Experience:

 A minimum of 5 years mid-level experience in educational leadership and administration, including team leadership, program development and delivery, strategic planning, financial management, business development and project management.

Other Knowledge/Training:

- Commitment to and practice of collaborative and consultative leadership with demonstrated experience in, trauma informed practice, Indigenous counselling and community safety, social justice and community-based education;
- Demonstrated ability to build and maintain strategic relationships, work in a collaborative team environment and build rapport and trust with stakeholders;
- Demonstrated complex project management skills;
- Demonstrated ability to exercise judgment, problem solve, and work with complex issues;
- Excellent written and oral communication skills;
- Experience writing proposals, business cases and briefing notes.
