Position Summary:

The Health Sciences Division at the Justice Institute of British Columbia invites applications for the position of Sessional Instructor within the Primary Care Paramedic (PCP) Program. The Sessional PCP Instructor is part of a dynamic faculty team committed to delivering high quality instruction. Successful applicants will be scheduled on an "as needed" basis to instruct PCP course offerings in Prince George, BC.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Has the ability to deliver and delivers all portions of the PCP program (fulltime & part-time model) within the pre-determined curriculum;
- Uses a variety of proven instruction methods based on an applied experiential learning model to deliver all portions of the PCP program instruction within the pre-determined curriculum;
- Works collaboratively with other sessional faculty to deliver all portions of the PCP program within the pre-determined curriculum;
- Mentors new faculty;
- Provides written and verbal feedback to the students;
- Conducts student evaluations;
- Identifies 'at-risk' students and directs them to the Lead Instructor or appropriate Student Support Services;
- Reviews student competencies in a timely manner using the programs electronic tracking system;
- Documents student progress for student records;
- Participates in PCP faculty meetings as required;
- Participates in the organizing and cares of program equipment and ambulances;
- Conducts student logbook reviews and meets with students to review competency attainment/signoff;
- Performs related duties, as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Minimum: PCP or equivalent certification/diploma;
- Completion of the JIBC Essential Skills for Training and Facilitation (INDC-1110) course or other equivalent teaching certification;
- A Provincial Instructor Diploma (or equivalent) would be considered an asset for this position;
- A related post-secondary diploma or degree would also be considered an asset;
- A minimum of 3 years' experience as a PCP level (or higher) Paramedic;
- Previous teaching experience.

Other Competencies Required:

- Effective communication skills (written and verbal);
- The ability to maintain effective working relationships with the students, Sessional Instructors, Lead Instructor, Regional Training Coordinator, Practice Education Coordinator and Program Managers;
- Excellent organizational and problem-solving skills with a proven ability to work under pressure while satisfying students' requests and applying relevant program and institutional policies, procedures and guidelines;
- Demonstrated proficiency at the intermediate level in Microsoft Office applications, web browser applications and the use of mobile devices.
