



Challenges with Change Management


I have been handcuffed in the care I can provide and the rationale does not make sense nor follow established best practices.








Key Findings and Impact

- MOST SIGNIFICANT FINDINGS ARE NOT A DIRECT RESULT OF COVID-19
- INCREASED STRESS AND UNCERTAINTY = EXACERBATION OF HISTORIC SYSTEMIC ISSUES AND INEQUITIES
- OPPORTUNITY TO IGNITE SYSTEMIC CHANGE AND IMPROVE WORKPLACE CULTURE


















