#### **Position Summary:**

JIBC is looking for a knowledgeable and collaborative Librarian to guide the metadata work in our Library and to coordinate collections.

The Librarian, Metadata & Collections, brings vision and expertise around cataloguing practice, the enhancement and remediation of metadata to improve discovery for Library users, and inclusivity and decolonization of our cataloguing and metadata practices. This position oversees and provides original and complex copy cataloguing with a systematic approach to data integrity and problem-solving in the catalogue. The person in the role also works closely with the Librarian, e-Resources and Systems and requires an understanding of how cataloguing and systems intersect, an analytical and "systems thinking" mindset, flexibility, and openness to change.

As coordinator of collections, this position collaborates with the library team to ensure that collection selection, deselection, acquisition, organization, and evaluation meet the current and future needs of Institute stakeholders and reflects emerging practices, standards, and trends. Includes the management of the physical collection.

The Librarian, Metadata & Collections, also acts as the liaison librarian for faculty from several divisions at JIBC, as well as teaching information literacy workshops and providing reference and AskAway services.

This librarian will join a team of two other librarians who work collaboratively with the Director, Library Services and a team of library technicians and assistants. The library team also works closely with other departments at JIBC.

• Master's Degree in Library Science from an ALA-accredited university.

## **Experience:**

- Minimum of two years post master's degree Library Science (MLIS) professional experience, academic preferred;
- Experience with integrated library systems and supporting library discovery interfaces;
- Experience with collection development;
- Experience providing reference services to students in a post-secondary environment;
- Experience delivering library instruction, preferably in an academic setting.

## Knowledge/Training:

- Knowledge or experience in subject areas such as fire, emergency medicine, criminology is an asset;
- Knowledge of trends, issues, and resources in digital library development, metadata and cataloging standards, and data management in academic libraries;
- Knowledge of adult education principles;
- Excellent knowledge and understanding of information literacy goals, trends and developments;
- Demonstrated ability to develop and deliver effective and engaging instruction sessions;
- Broad knowledge of print and electronic resources for a wide variety of disciplines;
- Comprehensive knowledge of reference services for a wide variety of subjects;
- Working knowledge of an integrated library system, preferably SIRSI;
- Working knowledge of educational technology as it applies to libraries, including BlackBoard LMS;
- Working knowledge of APA citation style;
- Familiarity with SpringShare products e.g., LibGuides and LibCal;
- Ability to ensure compliance with national and local standards, including LC Classification and other appropriate cataloguing and metadata standards;
- Ability to test and recommend new tools or processes for managing bibliographic metadata and associated workflows.

Infrequent evening and weekend work may be required.
