With a Master's degree in a relevant discipline, i.e., education, leadership or public administration or an equivalent combination of education and experience, the ideal candidate possesses senior leadership experience within a Fire Services organization. Progressive leadership experience at a post-secondary educational institution is preferred. The Director must stay abreast of developments in the fields of fire, safety, and adult education, and post-secondary leadership and administration, and maintain excellent relationships with key stakeholders. With a strategic, business-minded approach, the Director must demonstrate expertise in fostering innovation, problem-solving and introducing improvements to strengthen the Fire & Safety Division's programming and facilities. They will possess outstanding interpersonal and communication skills, a successful record of motivating effective teams, and the ability to cultivate a positive, productive, and collegial work environment.
