## Location Advisory for New Westminster Campus

**\* Please note:** the JIBC New Westminster campus, where this training will take place, is also the site for first responder training including police officers, paramedics, and emergency medical responders. During this training, you may encounter uniformed first responders in many areas inside and outside of the building as well as simulation activities and exercises. These simulations are meant to reflect real-life scenarios that first responders may encounter on the job and can include visual or auditory displays (e.g., an individual undergoing an arrest, de-escalation techniques with a volatile or violent individual, interactions with a distressed youth, etc.). There will be signage on campus indicating where a simulation is taking place. We can also provide supports for you, such as suggesting resources for your emotional and psychological wellness, debriefing any impact of encountering these simulations, or other supports which may be needed.
