

AGREEMENT FOR THE ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE
BETWEEN
JUSTICE INSTITUTE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, CANADA
AND
EIKEI UNIVERSITY OF HIROSHIMA, JAPAN

Justice Institute of British Columbia (JIBC), Canada and Eikei University of Hiroshima (EUH), Japan hereby agree to establish an agreement for academic and educational exchange with the purpose of promoting mutual cooperation through exchange in academic and research activities and exchange in educational activities with students and staff, thereby promoting academic and cultural exchange between both universities.

Areas of the exchange programs

1. Both institutions agree to cooperate in the following areas:
 - (1) Exchange of faculty members and administrative staff
 - (2) Exchange of undergraduate students
 - (3) Exchange of research results, academic materials and publications, and other academic or scholarly information
 - (4) Arrangement of research activities, seminars and symposia.

Project implementation

2. The areas listed above shall be implemented following mutual consultation.

Duration and termination

3. This agreement is intended for a five-year (5) period and shall be effective when it is signed by both universities. The agreement will be automatically extended for successive periods of five years each, unless either institute notifies the other in writing, at least six (6) months prior to the expiration of the agreement, of its intention to terminate the agreement.

Revision and abolition

4. Revisions to this agreement may be made with the consent of the two institutions. To this end, based on Article 3, both institutions must notify the other in writing, at least six months prior to the automatic extension.
5. This Memorandum of Understanding shall be construed as a statement of intent and is not binding on either party.

Should any questions on any part of this agreement arise, both institutions must consult with one another to find a resolution.

DETAILS OF THE AGREEMENT FOR STUDENT EXCHANGE
BETWEEN
JUSTICE INSTITUTE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, CANADA
AND
EIKEI UNIVERSITY OF HIROSHIMA, JAPAN

Justice Institute of British Columbia (JIBC), in Vancouver, Canada and Eikei University of Hiroshima(EUH), Japan hereby agree to determine each item concerning the implementation of the undergraduate student exchange (hereinafter referred to as “students exchange”), based on Article 1, Paragraph (2), of the Agreement for the Academic and Educational Exchange which both universities concluded.

1. Purpose

The purpose of the student exchange is to offer opportunities for participating undergraduate students (hereinafter referred to as “exchange students”) through educational services where the university accepts the exchange student in order to deepen mutual understanding among students of both institutions.

2. Term of exchange

The enrollment period for exchange students at the institution accepting the students shall not exceed a total of one year.

3. Number of exchange students

The number of exchange students shall be up to three (3) students per year from each university. Both institutions shall make reasonable efforts to accept equal numbers of exchange students during the agreement period.

4. Qualification of the exchange students

Exchange students must meet the following qualifications:

- (1) Exchange students must be undergraduate students of either institution and have obtained a recommendation from the institution they are currently attending; and
- (2) Must have a sufficient command of English required to study at the institutions and have sufficient evidence to prove this ability.

5. Status of the exchange students

Exchange students shall retain their status as students at the institution that sent them on the student exchange; however, they shall obey all school regulations of the host institution throughout the exchange period.

6. Permission to enroll

Exchange students enrollment shall be permitted by the host institution once they are selected based on the necessary documents submitted to that institution. The necessary documents shall be submitted at least three (3) months prior to the month in which the exchange students will enroll in the institution.

In cases where there is a violation of the preceding article or students become unable to study at the institution that has accepted them due to illness or other reasons, permission to study abroad may be revoked upon consultation with the accepting institution.

7. Exchange student registration

Exchange students shall be registered based on the school regulations at the accepting institution.

Both institutions shall provide the other with information related to the departments and subjects that can accept the exchange students at the proper timing.

8. Record of the study

The institution accepting the exchange students shall make a record of the studies of the exchange students based on the school regulations thereof, while providing academic performance certificates and information regarding the academic performance of the exchange students upon request of the institution who sent the students.

9. Approval of credits

If the level of a class and the number of credits earned by the exchange students can be deemed equivalent or higher to those at the institution that sent them, then the credits may be approved.

10. Tuition and other fees

The institution that has accepted the exchange students shall not collect testing, application or tuition fees from the exchange students. The exchange students shall pay tuition to their original institutions.

11. Assistance provided by host institutions

The host institution shall provide the necessary assistance to ensure smooth operation of the student exchange, including taking steps to prepare for enrollment and recommendation of reasonable accommodations. The exchange students shall receive convenient services in using the facilities equivalent to those used by other students at the host institution.

12. Financial responsibility of the institution

The student exchange based on these details shall not require both institutions to bear any costs whatsoever.

13. Health/Medical Insurance

Exchange students shall purchase medical and hospitalization insurance program before arriving to a host country and submit a copy of the insurance policy to the host institution. Depending on the regulations of the host country, exchange students must also purchase a national health insurance program. Exchange students shall have these insurance programs for the period of the exchange program.

14. Emergency response

When a state of emergency occurs due to natural disaster, unforeseeable accident, or the like, both institutions shall communicate as soon as possible to provide appropriate assistance to ensure the safety of the students.

15. Special notes

When a situation not specified in this agreement arises, both institutions shall consult with one another as soon as possible to provide an accurate response.

16. Starting student exchange

The student exchange shall begin from the date of signature of this document.

17. Expiration, etc.

These details shall have effect for five years from the day that the representatives of both institutions append their signatures, and shall be automatically renewed unless either or both of the institutions request an amendment or abolition of the details six months prior to the expiration. For amendment and abolition of these details, both institutions shall notify each other with a written form, at least six months prior to the expiration.

18. Student Information

Each institution acknowledges that the sharing/exchange of student record information or personally identifiable information of exchange students may be needed to facilitate the student exchange. Each institution agrees to: (i) comply with all privacy laws applicable to it; (ii) assist the other in obtaining any needed consents for sharing such information; (iii) take appropriate steps to protect its confidentiality and to protect that information from data breaches and inadvertent disclosure; and (iv) promptly notify the other institution in the event of a data breach or inadvertent disclosure.


