

Articulation Agreement

Justice Institute of British Columbia

and

Yorkville University

This Articulation Agreement (AA) establishes a formal partnership between Yorkville University (Yorkville or YU) and Justice Institute of British Columbia (JIBC) to facilitate the transition of students from Justice Institute of [British Columbia's Associate Certificate in Complex Trauma program](#) to the Master of Arts in Counselling Psychology (MACP) program at Yorkville University.

Background

Yorkville University (Yorkville or YU) and Justice Institute of British Columbia (JIBC), collectively referred to as the "Parties," recognize the value of collaboration and mutual cooperation in facilitating academic pathways for students pursuing higher education. This Articulation Agreement (AA) outlines the terms and conditions for the articulation agreement between the two institutions to facilitate the seamless transition of students from Justice Institute of British Columbia's Complex Trauma program to the MACP program at Yorkville University.

1. Purpose and Goals

- 1.1. The purpose of this agreement is to establish a formal pathway for students enrolled in Complex Trauma program to transition into the MACP program at Yorkville.
- 1.2. The above goals will be accomplished by undertaking activities outlined in this document.

2. Transfer Credits

- 2.1. Students who have successfully completed the Associate Certificate in Complex Trauma program at JIBC may apply for transfer credits towards the MACP program at Yorkville.
- 2.2. A maximum of 3 credits earned at JIBC may be eligible for transfer, subject to approval by Yorkville's admissions department.
- 2.3. These transfer credits will replace equivalent courses at Yorkville (as per [Appendix A](#)), allowing students to reduce the duration of their master's program and overall tuition fees accordingly.
- 2.4. The evaluation and approval of transfer credits will be conducted by the admissions department at Yorkville.
- 2.5. Yorkville reserves the right to accept or reject transfer credits based on the student's academic transcript.

3. Admission Requirements and application process

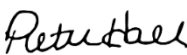
- 3.1. Students seeking admission to the MACP program at Yorkville University under this agreement must meet all admission requirements set forth by Yorkville.
- 3.2. Students must submit a formal application for admission to Yorkville, along with relevant

documents for transfer credits.

4. Duration

- 4.1. This AA is at-will and may be modified by mutual consent of authorized officials from JIBC and Yorkville.
- 4.2. This AA shall commence upon the effective date of signature by both Parties. This AA will remain in effect until modified or terminated by any one of the partners by mutual consent. In the absence of mutual agreement by the authorized officials from (JIBC and Yorkville) this AA shall end without notice on the 5th anniversary date of its first signing, unless reestablished by the parties at least 30 days prior to expiration.
